# MiTribe Leadership Guide

#### Welcome, MiTribe Leader!

Thank you so much for answering the call of discipleship. Here is the Blueprint for running a MiTribe:

**Create a Hangout:** Find two or three friends and secure a space where the group can routinely meet and feel safe, included, and comfortable. Pray for God to expand your tribe.





**Start With Food:** Begin your meeting time connecting socially, and be intentional to learn more about everyone in the group.

**Share & Pray:** After your meal, ask the group if they have anything they want the Tribe to pray about. Keep a journal to revisit old requests and see how God worked in their lives.





**Bible Study:** Follow a plan everyone can have access to. We highly recommend the MiTribe study plan (attached below) and questions. It has over a year's worth of stories to study as a group.

**Find a Cause to Act on:** THIS IS A MUST! Mow lawns, tutor students, or any other cause that makes this world a better place. We cannot stress enough the importance of serving together. This will greatly affect the health of your Tribe.





**Stay Organized and Communicate:** Create a group chat and shared calendar that includes everyone who has come to your Tribe and even people who haven't but you want to. Consistently remind them when and where the next meeting/event is and what the Bible topic is to be discussed.

#### As a leader, your role is vital to the tribe's success.

Here are some best practices to consider as you start the group:

#### **Prepare Spiritually**

You can't lead if you don't follow Jesus first. Spend time in personal prayer and Bible study to be spiritually grounded and ready to guide others. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with His power. We can do nothing without Him.

### **Encourage Participation**

Use the open-ended questions in the study guide and foster discussion rather than lecturing. Encourage the Tribe to explore Scripture themselves.

### **Ask Them to Help**

Ask them to bring food, lead a portion of the Tribe, or do outreach—anything that will get them engaged. Follow-Up: After the study, follow up with individuals to see how they are applying what they learned and to provide support.
